- 17. Should any other regulatory agency require changes to the permitted system, the permittee shall provide written notification to EPD of the change prior to implementation so that a determination can be made whether a permit modification is required.
- 18. EPD must have final construction plan approval to ensure that no modification has been made during the construction plan process.
- 19. The permittee shall immediately notify EPD, in writing, of any previously submitted information that is later discovered to be inaccurate.
- 20. The permittee shall notify EPD, in writing, within thirty days of any sale, conveyance, or other transfer of ownership or control of the permitted system or the real property at which the permitted system is located. The permittee shall remain liable for any corrective actions that maybe required as a result of any permit violations until the permit is legally transferred.
- 21. EPD staff, with proper identification, shall have permission to enter the site at any reasonable time to either, at a minimum: inspect, sample, or test to ensure conformity with the plans and specifications approved by the permit.
- 22. The permittee shall hold and save the County harmless from any and all damages, claims or liabilities, which may arise by reason of the activities authorized by the permit.
- 23. No failure or successive failures, on the part of EPD to enforce any portion of this perm it shall impair the right of EPD to enforce the same in the event of subsequent breach.

- 24. All costs, including attorney's fees, incurred by the County in enforcing the terms and conditions of this permit may be required to be paid by the permittee. The Environmental Protection Officer shall make this determination.
- 25. Permittee agrees that any dispute arising from matters relating to this permit shall be governed by the laws of Florida, and initiated only in Orange County.
- 26. Turbidity and sediments must be controlled to prevent violations of water quality pursuant to Rule 62-302.500, 62-302.530(70) and 62-4.242 Florida Administrative Code (FAC). Best Management Practices, as specified in the Florida Stormwater, Erosion, and Sedimentation Control Inspector's Manual, shall be installed and maintained at all locations where the possibility of transferring suspended solids into wetlands and/or surface waters due to the permittee shall implement them as necessary to prevent adverse impacts to wetlands and/or surface waters.
- 27. The existing ambient water quality within Outstanding Florida Waters shall not be lowered as a result of the proposed activity, except as authorized by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection under Rule 62-4.242(2) FAC.
- 28. Any un-permitted impacts to wetlands and/or littoral zone as a result of the permitted activity shall result in the permittee restoring the impact to the satisfaction of EPD.
