Describe Project/Proposal

The County is proposing to amend the local discharge limits of the Sewer Use Ordinance based on evaluations performed by the Seminole County Industrial Pretreatment Program and reviewed by (FDEP). These discharge limits are designed to protect Seminole County Wastewater Facilities and to keep the Facilities in compliance with (FDEP) regulation regarding pollutant limits. This is an update of the existing local discharge limits.

Describe the Direct Economic Impact of the Project/Proposal upon the Operation of the County

There is no direct economic impact upon the operation of the County as a result of this update.

Describe the Direct Economic Impact of the Project/Proposal upon the Property Owners/Tax Payers/Citizens who are Expected to be Affected
