## Summary/Highlights:

The county thoroughfare impact fee ordinance allows an exemption when property is redeveloped and buildings are removed. The exemptions are calculated based on the amount of traffic trips generated by the previous use of the property. Those trips are deducted from any additional impact fees that may be owed due to the use of the property under the new construction. If the new construction does not use all of the exemptions, they stay with the parcel on which the original structure was built.

Recent redevelopment has included projects with multiple parcels that are adjoining, including parcels across a roadway. To encourage these types of redevelopment, it is recommended that the code be amended to allow exemptions to be used on adjoining parcels subject to a single planned master development, or on adjoining parcels combined under a common ownership or joint venture for the purpose of integrated redevelopment.
