RESOLUTION NO. 2016- _____

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A CITY OF TAMPA PROGRAM TO BE KNOWN AS "FOOD FOR FINES"; ALLOWING FOR PAYMENT OF CERTAIN PARKING CITATIONS, OR PORTION THEREOF, TO BE PAID WITH DONATIONS OF CANNED FOOD ITEMS PURSUANT TO CITY OF TAMPA PARKING CODE, SECTION 15-121 (G); PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on xxx, the City Council of the City of Tampa adopted Ordinance No. xxx, allowing for alternative forms of payment for parking ticket violations; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to allow motorists to pay their parking fines with donated canned goods; and

WHEREAS, the goal of the program is to raise awareness about and generate donations to feed the hungry during the holiday season; and

WHEREAS, City Council has determined that it would be beneficial to the Citizens of the City to implement this program; and

WHEREAS, the food collected will be collected at the City of Tampa Parking Administrative Offices at Fort Brooke Parking Garage – 1st Floor, 107 North Franklin Street, Tampa, Florida 33602 during the hours of operation, Monday through Friday 8:00 AM-5:00 PM; and

WHEREAS, the food items will be donated to Feeding Tampa Bay; and

WHEREAS, the following parameters will apply:

- a) Donated canned food items parameters: \$1.00 per canned food item at a maximum credit of \$15.00 will be applied toward payment of a current expired meter parking citation issued by the City of Tampa Parking Division on November 14, 2016 through December 16, 2016 within in the City's Downtown area. (Current parking citations are those which have been issued within 14 days from the date of issue and have not accumulated any late fees); or
- b) Provide a voucher from Feeding Tampa Bay, or similar food donation type charity, of donated food items where \$1.00 per canned food item at a maximum credit of \$15.00 will be applied toward payment of a current expired meter parking citation issued by the City of Tampa Parking Division on November 14, 2016 through December 16, 2016 within in the City's Downtown area; and
- c) Only one citation per motorist is eligible; and
- d) Damaged, expired, or opened items will not be accepted.

NOW THEREFORE,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TAMPA, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. That "Food for Fines" parking citation payment program is hereby approved as described above.

Section 2. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

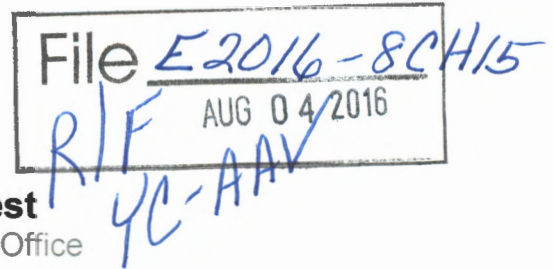

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ORDINANCE NO. 2016- _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TAMPA, FLORIDA, AMENDING CITY OF TAMPA CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 15 - PARKING, ARTICLE II - REGULATIONS; PERMITS; PENALTIES, DIVISION 4 - PENALTIES, SECTION 22-121 - PENALTIES FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS; TICKET CANCELLATION PRIVILEGES; TO ALLOW PAYMENT TO BE MADE BY OTHER FORMS OF PAYMENT APPROVED BY CITY COUNCIL; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Tampa established standards related to parking in the City of Tampa;

WHEREAS, the City of Tampa desires to amend the City of Tampa Code of Ordinances Chapter 15, Parking;

WHEREAS, section 22-121 of the City of Tampa Code of Ordinances set forth certain penalties for parking violations and ticket cancellation privileges in the City of Tampa;

WHEREAS, the City of Tampa desires to amend the City of Tampa Code of Ordinances, Chapter 15 - Parking, Division 4 - Penalties, Section 22-121- Penalties for parking violations; ticket cancellation privileges, to allow payment to be made by other forms of payment approved by City Council;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the requirements of law have been met and it is in the best interest of the City to enact this amendment to Chapter 15, the City Council hereby takes the following action.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TAMPA, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That the recitals set forth above are hereby incorporated as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. That **Section 15-121. - Penalties for parking violations; ticket cancellation privileges**, is hereby amended by adding the underlined as subsection g) as follows:

“(g) Payment made pursuant to this Section may be made by authorized legal tender or other forms of payment approved by Resolution upon the recommendation of the Mayor and approved by City Council.”

Section 3. That all ordinances and conflicts herewith are repealed to the extent of any conflict.

Section 4. That if any part of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions at the City of Tampa’s election shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect within thirty (30) days upon becoming a law.

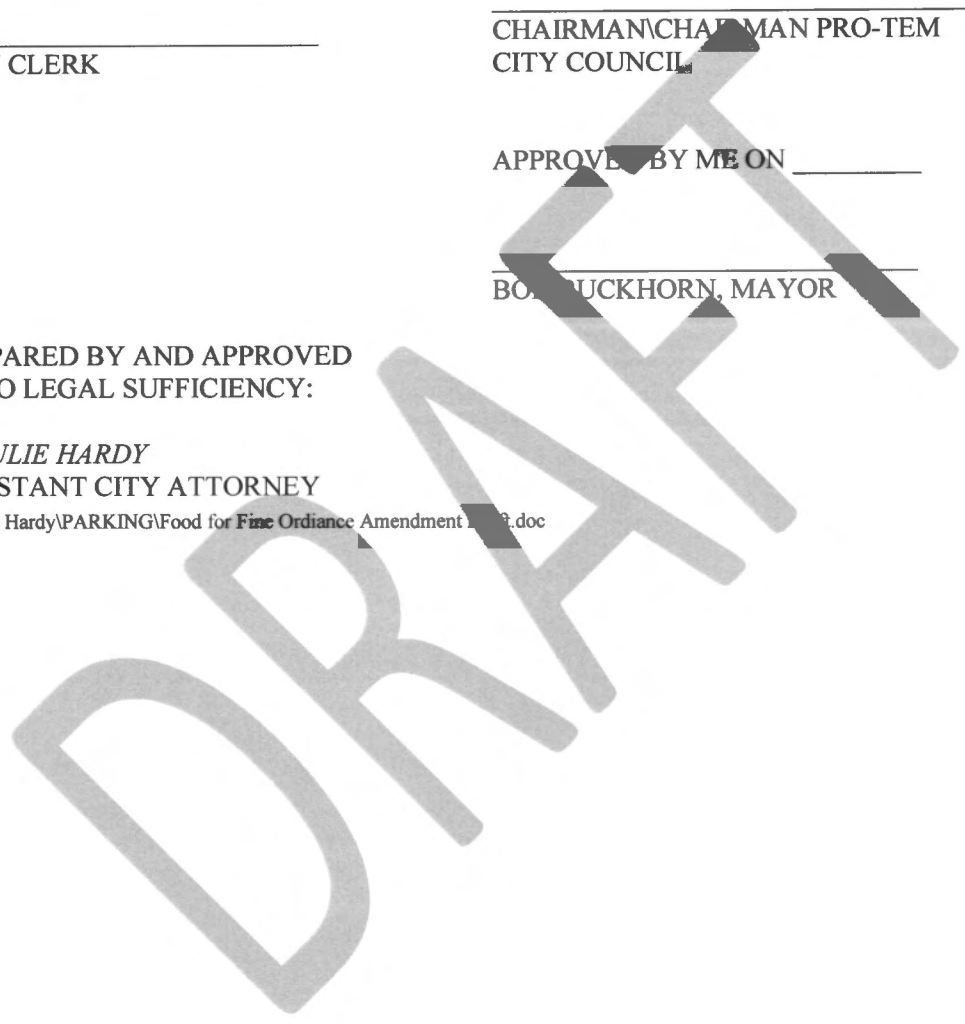

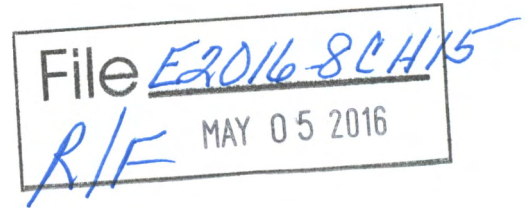

Food for Fines Initiative

May 5, 2016

Considerations:

- How much food will be required to "pay" a fine?
- What types of food would be accepted?
- Time Frame?
- Which local food bank would receive the cans?
- For what types of tickets will the donations be accepted?
- Cost Analysis.
- Most parking fines in Tampa run \$25-\$30. Parking in a handicapped spot runs \$251.
- Code Amendment/ Resolution.



How it has been implemented in other jurisdictions:

Tallahassee, Florida

- Allowed first-time offenders to donate 1 perishable food item for every \$1 credit toward their parking fine.
- Program ran December 3-January 4, 2015 for tickets issued during the time period beginning Nov. 30.
- \$50 cap.
- Only non-perishable food items accepted.
- No expired, damaged, or opened items are accepted.
- Fines typically start at \$10.

Savannah, Georgia

- From Dec. 7-17, parking citation for an expired meter or overtime in a time zone could get that ticket waived by donating 10 canned food items.
- 1 parking citation may be excused for a donation of 10 or more canned food items.
 - Any accumulated late fees on that citation would be excused as well.
- Excuses a citation on another vehicle for another donation of 10 or more canned food items.
- Acceptable canned foods include:
 - Peanut butter
 - Canned meat and protein such as canned ravioli, chicken, ham, tuna, meat spreads, etc.
 - Beef stew and soup
 - Canned vegetables such as beans, peas, carrots and corn
- Expired items not accepted.

Lexington, Kentucky (Parking Authority):

- Donation of 10 canned food items received a \$15 credit on any parking citations issued from Nov. 16 through Dec. 18.
- Customers with multiple citations could bring in 10 cans per citation to receive the discount. For example, for a \$30 ticket, customers can bring in 20 canned food items instead of paying \$30 cash.
- Past-due parking citations also eligible for the program.
- In 2014, the program took in more than 6,000 cans of donated food.

Albany, New York:

- Late penalty amnesty program whereby any and all late penalties on parking ticket(s) prior to July 31 of the current year are eliminated if parking tickets and surcharges are paid in return for donations to the Food Pantries of the Capital Region.
- Dismisses a \$25 late fee in exchange for canned goods.
- Donations must be non-perishable, unexpired and unopened food items.
- Alternatively, donations may be made to local food pantries directly, (City supplies a list of local drop off locations), or make cash donations via The Food Pantries of the Capital Region website.
- Encourages donating protein items like canned tuna, chicken and beans.
- Donations are not required to participate in the late penalty amnesty program.
- From September to November of 2015, the city waived late fees for everyone paying off parking tickets, whether or not they donated food.

Cincinnati, Ohio

- Late penalty amnesty program whereby people who have 1 or 2 meter violations, issued in the current year, may pay their \$45 ticket but avoid paying the extra \$45 penalty by donating 10 canned goods.
- The 10 canned goods should be no less than 12 ounces each.
- Food for Fines runs Monday - Friday, Dec. 15 - Dec. 19. Participants should visit the cashier windows on the second floor of City Hall between 8 - 5 p.m.
- Only one ticket per individual would be accepted.
- Those who took part were asked to bring a copy of the past due ticket, and if possible, the citation number.
