Need:

To approve the renewal of the Interlocal Agreement regarding the cost share support of the water conservation incentives program.

Summary Explanation/ Background:

The Interlocal Agreement between Broward County and the City of Lauderhill to provide Cost Share Support of a Water Conservation Incentives Program to be coordinated by Broward County within the City's water utility service areas and to authorize the county to conduct specific medial promotion, outreach, administrative and other activities associated with fostering a county-wide water conservation ethic in partnership with the city came time for renewal during the City Commission summer break. The City Manager executed the Agreement as it was time sensitive and this resolution approves the retroactive execution of the agreement. This Resolution provides for the cost allocation in the amount of \$27,940.00 for the first year.
