

County Administrator's Organization

Affordable Housing Services

- A-1 Adopt the resolution and approve the real property transfer agreement conveying the County-owned Neighborhood Stabilization Program property on the affordable housing inventory list and located at 5212 S. 82nd Street to Rebuilding Together Tampa Bay Inc. There is no financial impact associated with this agenda item.
- A-2 Adopt the resolution and approve the real property transfer agreement conveying the County-owned Neighborhood Stabilization Program property on the affordable housing inventory list and located at 4712 S. 87th Street to Rebuilding Together Tampa Bay Inc. There is no financial impact associated with this agenda item.

Code Enforcement

A-3 Approve the release of the demolition lien assessed by Resolution R89-0266 in the amount of \$6,005 against the property located at 922 4th St., Wimauma, FL 33598, formerly known as 922 S. 4th St., Wimauma, FL 33598, Folio 079273.0000, for the costs incurred by the County for the demolition and removal of a deteriorated structure and removal of trash, junk, and debris. The property owner has paid in full all demolition costs incurred with removing the structure(s), and a release of lien is being requested

Conservation and Environmental Lands Management

A-4 Accept a monetary donation totaling \$10,000 from Gus Muench in support of the County's Jan K. Platt Environmental Lands Acquisition and Protection Program, and approve a budget amendment to appropriate the funds into the Bell Creek Preserve cost center.

County Attorney's Office

A-5 Ratify and approve a mediated settlement agreement in the inverse condemnation lawsuit entitled Nelis v. Hillsborough County, Circuit Civil Case 15-010956. The monetary terms of the mediated settlement agreement are to pay Michael L. Nelis, Dena L. Nelis and Freeda Mae Nelis, LP, a Limited Partnership, the amount of \$510,000 for approximately 3.99 acres of property adjacent to Hillsborough County's Boyette Road rights-of-way, identified as Parcel 100 in the legal description and parcel sketch, and to pay \$115,000.00, pursuant to Section 73.092(2), Florida Statutes, for all attorneys' fees and costs, in full settlement of any and all claims against the County in this inverse condemnation matter. There is adequate funding in the FY 17 transportation CIP budget for the Boyette Road Phase III project, CIP 69124, to support payment of this claim.

Economic Development

A-6 Adopt the resolution recommending that the Tampa Hillsborough Economic Development Corporation's (EDC) Prospect 16-338 (the 'Prospect') be approved as a Qualified Target Industry (QTI) business, pursuant to Florida's QTI Tax Refund Program, and providing up to \$9,000 of local financial support, for the expansion of an information technology operation in the City of Tampa, which is expected to create 30 new, higher-wage, quality jobs. The maximum cost to the County for this QTI applicant is \$9,000 spread over a minimum of five years, beginning in FY 18. Funding for this initiative will be included in the Countywide Area Economic Development Activity Funds in the Economic Development Department's FY 18 planned budget. No additional County funds

are required. Subject to approval of such budget and future budgets and appropriations, funding will be provided for this initiative through FY 24.

Fire Rescue

- A-7 Accept the FY 2016 Homeland Security grant award of \$15,593 from the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management, Agreement 17-DS-V4-08-39-01-XXX, CFDA 97.067, for Hillsborough County Fire Rescue Department, Office of Emergency Management, to provide training and assistance with the WebEOC software, which performs various situational awareness, planning, operational, logistical, and financial functions during emergency events. The agreement shall begin upon execution by both parties and end December 31, 2017. Upon execution of the agreement, a budget amendment will be submitted to the Board to appropriate \$15,593 in grants and aids funds, which will increase the Fire Rescue Department grants budget by \$15,593.
- A-8 Approve budget amendment to increase the FY 17 Fire Rescue grant budget by \$53,294 from FY 16 budget in carryover funds from the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management Grant, Contract 16-DS-T9-08-39-01-415, CFDA 97.067. The Board originally appropriated the full amount of the grant agreement of \$120,904 on May 18, 2016. This budget amendment brings forward the remaining balance of the grant funds from FY 16 and appropriates funding in FY 17. The carryover is necessary as the actual expenditures did not come in as planned when the FY 17 Budget was prepared. The budget amendment increases the FY 17 Fire Rescue Department grants budget as follows: operating expenditures/expenses by \$33,764 (\$58,000 to \$91,764), \$6,000 in personnel services (\$0 to \$6,000), and \$13,530 in grants and aids (\$0 to \$13,530).
- A-9 Approve a budget amendment to increase the FY 17 Fire Rescue grant budget by \$27,585 from FY 16 budget in carryover funds from the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management, Hazardous Materials Planning and Data Update grant, Contract 17-CP-11-08-39-01-176. The Board originally appropriated the full amount of the grant agreement of \$30,373 on August 3, 2016. This budget amendment brings forward the remaining balance of the grant funds from FY 16 and appropriates funding in FY 17. The carryover is necessary as the actual expenditures did not come in as planned when the FY 17 budget was prepared. The budget amendment increases the FY 17 Fire Rescue Department grants budget as follows: operating expenditures/expenses by \$27,585 (\$0 to \$27,585).

Head Start/Early Head Start

A-10 Approve a budget amendment request to increase the FY 16 budget by the amount of \$436,910, representing funds approved by the Region IV Office of Head Start, for carry over from the FY 15 Head Start grant to the FY 16 Head Start grant. The funds will be used to complete the purchase of seven school buses serving the Head Start program. This budget amendment reduces the FY 15 Head Start grant by \$436,910 (from \$23,574,406 to \$23,137,496) and increases the FY 16 grant by \$436,910 (from \$23,574,406 to \$24,011,316).

Health Care Services

- A-11 Approve the fourteenth modification to Agreement 12-0209 with State of Florida, Department of Health, Department of Health-Hillsborough County f/k/a Hillsborough County Health Department (Health Department), increasing oral health care funding from \$226,721 to \$306,721; decreasing outpatient/ambulatory medical care from \$1,180,892 to \$930,892; AIDS pharmaceutical funding from \$1,011,230 to \$986,230; revising the number of clients to be served and units of service to be provided to coincide with the revised funding amount; and revising the federal award identification Exhibit of the Agreement for the period beginning March 1, 2016, and ending February 28, 2017. No clients are going without services. The funding for this modification is included in the department's FY 17 adopted budget. This agreement is totally grant funded.
- A-12 Approve the nineteenth modification to Agreement 12-0217 with AIDS Service Association of Pinellas Inc., under Part A of the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Extension Act, decreasing substance abuse counseling from \$81,000 to \$8,623; decreasing the number of clients to be served and units of service to be provided to coincide with the

revised funding amount; and revising the federal award identification Exhibit of the Agreement for the period beginning March 1, 2016, and ending February 28, 2017. No clients are going without services. The funding for this modification is included in the department's FY 17 adopted budget. This agreement is totally grant funded.

A-13 Terminate the agreement (BOCC 09-1333) with CFBHN to serve as the certified Medicaid billing agent for the Florida Medicaid Certified Match Program for Substance Abuse, in accordance with Article 22, effective October 1, 2016. Termination of this agreement will have no direct financial impact on Countywide General Funds.

Human Resources - Professional Development

- A-14 Approve the 2017 holiday schedule as outlined in the agenda material. The schedule includes two floating holidays and ten fixed holidays for five-day work week employees. Schedules for four-day work week employees will vary slightly based on assigned work schedules. Further, that the Board include in its approval, the authorization for appointing authorities who have employees working in the Plant City area to designate one of the two floating holidays as Strawberry Festival Parade Day, if they so desire. Funding for holiday pay is in the FY 17 adopted budget as part of the departments' personnel budget.
- Ratify and approve the FY 2017 Wage Reopener (Article 13) of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), Local 167, and the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC), effective October 1, 2015, to September 30, 2017. The Wage Reopener is also contingent upon the ratification and approval of this agreement by the employees represented by the AFSCME. Hillsborough County will be notified of the results of that vote on or about October 19, 2016. The Wage Reopener provides for a wage adjustment, a merit increase, and a minimum pay rate increase. The wage adjustment is an increase to an eligible employee's base salary of 2.75 percent up to the maximum of the pay range, effective the first full pay period in January 2017. If the 2.75 percent increase exceeds the maximum of the pay range for an employee, then the amount that exceeds the maximum of the pay range will be paid to the employee in a lump sum in the first full pay period of January 2017. An eligible employee may also receive a merit increase of 0.5 percent up to the maximum of the pay range during the first pay period in August 2017, if the score on their performance evaluation is 3.80 or higher. In addition, all employees who are compensated at an hourly rate of less than \$11.00 per hour will receive a wage increase to \$11.00 per hour effective the first full pay period in April 2017. The estimated FY 17 fiscal impact for the Wage Reopener is \$1,000,870, including estimates for wages and related benefits. The impact falls across many funds and is accommodated within the adopted FY 17 budget.

Internal Auditor

- A-16 Approve the individual scope of services for the Information Technology Security and Management performance audit. No budget impact at this time. Once the scope of services is approved, the contracting of this performance audit will be conducted with the requests for proposals method of procurement. Procurement Services will bring the contract back to the Board for approval of the vendor recommended to perform the audit services.
- A-17 Receive and accept the status report from the Internal Auditor regarding the external Quality Assurance Review (compliance audit) of the County Internal Audit Department. No other official Board action is necessary. The Internal Auditor will keep the Board appraised as the audit moves forward.

Library Services

A-18 Approve and execute the grant agreement with the Florida Department of State, Division of Library and Information Services, for the previously awarded \$500,000 Public Library Construction grant for the replacement of the C. Blythe Andrews Jr. Library located at 2607 E. Dr. Martin Luther Luther King Jr. Boulevard in Tampa. Funding for the library construction is included in the adopted FY 16 -FY 21 Capital Improvement Program

- (Project C76017000). The grant funds will augment the construction project budget by \$500,000, allowing for additional square footage or library service to citizens.
- A-19 Approve, pursuant to BOCC Policy 03.04.26.00, the removal of Library Services' uncollectible accounts for the period 10/1/2012 through 9/30/2013. This action reduces both the accounts receivable and allowance for doubtful accounts in the County's financial system by \$491,318.31 for customer accounts that have remained uncollected for more than three years. Of the initial \$798,273.52 in delinquent accounts, our third-party vendor recovered \$306,955.21, or 38 percent, which is higher than the State's average of 35 percent for recovered fees. This recommended action does not waive or diminish these obligations but recognizes that collection is improbable. Respective customer account privileges are suspended and remain so until full restitution is made. The number of uncollectible accounts is expected to decline each year as digital circulation increases and the need to recover overdue fines, fees, and materials from patrons is reduced.
- A-20 (A) Approve the FY 17 grant agreement for the previously awarded emerging needs grant from the Children's Board of Hillsborough County for the Mobile Interactive Literacy Opportunity (MILO) initiative at Hillsborough County libraries and Children's Board Family Resource Centers. (B) Accept and appropriate the Children's Board of Hillsborough County FY 17 continuation grant funds of \$9,500 within the FY 2016-2017 grant to bring the Library Services budget in line with the grant award. The MILO initiative gives Hillsborough County children and their families opportunities to visit a public library or resource center in their community for free, engaging, interactive literacy events that will encourage family reading and lead to higher educational success. This budget amendment increases the FY 17 budget by \$9,500. No additional County funds are required.
- A-21 Approve and execute the Microsoft Volume Licensing Program Signature Form and referenced contract documents consisting of the School Subscription Enrollment, Amendment to School Subscription Enrollment, and Campus & School Agreement (CA). The amendment to enrollment establishes the licensed period retroactive to September 26, 2016, through September 30, 2019. The CA allows Library Services to take advantage of State contract pricing at a significant cost savings. The CA also simplifies software licensing, budgeting, and administration by providing a single agreement through which they can manage all Microsoft software. There will not be any additional financial impact to the department's budget associated with the enrollment into the Microsoft School Subscription in conjunction with the CA. Funding for the purchase of Microsoft products over the three-year enrollment term is estimated to be \$209,399.40 and is available within the current Library Services approved budget. Funding for software purchases under this CA is part of Library Services Department's approved budget.

Management and Budget

Approve a First Amendment to the New York Yankees Facility Renovation Agreement (the 'FRA Amendment'), an Addendum to the Amended and Restated George M. Steinbrenner Field License Agreement, and a First Amendment to the Amended and Restated George M. Steinbrenner Field License Agreement (collectively, the 'GMS License Amendment') and a First Amendment to the Amended and Restated Himes Player Development Complex License Agreement (the 'Himes License Amendment'), between the Tampa Sports Authority (the 'TSA'), New York Yankees Partnership (the 'Partnership') and Hillsborough County (the 'County'), in substantially the forms in the background. Generally, the FRA Amendment, the GMS License Amendment, and the Himes License Amendment amend existing agreements pertaining to the design, construction, and financing of certain renovation improvements to the Partnership's spring training facilities for the principal purpose of addressing various requirements, contingencies, and the timing associated with the TSA's application with the State of Florida, pursuant to Section 288.11631, Florida Statutes, for certification to receive State funding for a facility for a spring training franchise. Bond proceeds from a future TSA or County financing to be repaid with State funding upon approval of the TSA application, and bond proceeds from a future County financing to be repaid with 4th Cent TDT will serve as the only repayment sources of the financial obligations of the TSA and the County under the referenced agreements, as amended. No General Fund monies will be obligated for this purpose.

Operations and Legislative Affairs

A-23 Approve a FY 16 budget amendment to appropriate \$18,453 from the Safe and Sound fund reserves to reimburse the Community Development Corporation of Tampa Bay program-related costs to administer the Safe and Sound Hillsborough program. This budget amendment reduces reserves by \$18,453 (from (\$300,000 to \$281,547) and increases operating costs from \$355,300 to \$373,753).

Public Utilities

- A-24 Approve the second modification agreement to the contract with Arcadis U.S. Inc. (Arcadis) dated August 3, 2011, and concerning County RPS S-0061-0-2011/LP, entitled professional engineering services for pump station (SCADA) Phase II, to authorize additional contract services and to increase total funding for these services. This second modification agreement increases the total contract amount by \$262,703.33, from \$4,819,934 to \$5,082,637.33, and sufficient funds are available in the department's approved budget for CIP 10794 to accommodate the increase.
- A-25 Approve the first modification agreement to the contract awarded to CJ's Sales and Service of Ocala Inc., for Bid ITB-P-0025-0-2014/MWK, generator maintenance and repair. This first modification for Group 2 (Public Utilities) will increase the agreement amount by \$100,000, from \$475,036.00 to \$575,036.00, which increases the overall agreement, which includes other departments, by \$100,000, from \$758,204 to \$858,204. The Public Utilities Department performs monthly routine inspection and maintenance on generators. This inspection and maintenance process has identified additional work that needs to be performed on aging generators to keep them in functioning order. This increase will also allow the department to provide maintenance and repair services for two additional generators that need to be added since the majority of the expansion efforts at South County have been concluded. Pricing is considered fair and reasonable, based on the existing prices being paid under this contract. This first modification agreement can be adequately funded within the Public Utilities Department approved annual operating budget. Purchase orders will be issued only against approved budgets.
- A-26 Set a public hearing on November 16, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. for the purpose of adopting a resolution to state the Board of County Commissioners' intent to use the uniform method of collecting a non-ad valorem assessment. This assessment is to fund a portion of impact fees otherwise payable prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy, for property located within three established impact fee assessment units. It is estimated that the County will collect \$1,154,112.60 annually, commencing with the ad valorem tax bill in November 2017, which is included in the FY 17 budget.

Public Works

- A-27 Authorize the Chairman to sign Form AW-230-1 acknowledging that the County continues to implement and regulate activities associated with the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), Community Rating System (CRS), to better protect the public from risks associated with flood hazards. No County funds are required. Approval of this item will allow the County to remain in the NFIP CRS program, which currently benefits unincorporated County residents with up to 25 percent discounts on federal flood insurance premiums with estimated annual savings to residents of over \$6 million dollars. The Chairman's signature of approval indicates that the County will continue to implement floodplain management, pursuant to the CRS program, which will continue discounts to residents. Otherwise, federal flood insurance premiums will increase for unincorporated County residents. There is no financial impact to the County budget.
- A-28 Approve the interlocal agreement between the County and the City of Plant City (Plant City) for traffic control signal maintenance for five traffic signals owned by the County, which Plant City will maintain. The County agrees to reimburse Plant City for actual maintenance costs, up to \$5,000 per year, for each signal. The maximum total cost for maintenance of the five traffic signals will not exceed \$25,000 per year. This agreement is for a two-year term, retroactive to June 1, 2015, through September 30, 2017. The actual annual maintenance cost is

- to be paid by the FY 17 adopted operations budget allotted by Public Works for the traffic signal maintenance and operation.
- A-29 Approve the FY 17 State aid contractual services agreement with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to provide State funding to assist with providing mosquito control services. This agreement is effective October 1, 2016, and will expire on September 30, 2017. Funding is contingent upon the State's approval of this document and will be in an amount not to exceed \$43,009 in State operating funds, which is already included in the FY 17 operating budget for Public Works.
- A-30 Authorize the County Administrator, or his designee, to execute the Federal Office of Management Budget (OMB) Form MT-2 (OMB 1660-0016) to submit a County-initiated application to update a portion of the Flood Insurance Rate Maps for the Bull Frog Creek through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) process, pursuant to Chapter 44, Codes of Federal Regulations (CFR), Ch. 1, Section 65.4, to recognize changes created through approved developments. This authorization will not have a fiscal impact upon the County's budget.

Real Estate and Facilities Services

- A-31 Adopt resolutions: (A) Determining a reasonable necessity to acquire fee simple road and intersection rights-of-way for the public purpose of constructing road and intersection improvements for the intersection of Front Street and Valrico Road, CIP 69601.402, in Hillsborough County, Florida; (B) Authorizing good faith presuit negotiations and the acquisition of such properties and associated property rights by eminent domain proceedings, if necessary, for the project; (C) Authorizing and directing the Hillsborough County Attorney's Office and Real Estate and Facilities Services Department to acquire such property and associated property rights in the name of Hillsborough County, without further approval from this Board, provided that the amounts expended to acquire such property and associated property rights can be adequately accommodated within the project's current budget, and to fully compensate the interested parties as required by law. Acquisition of Parcels 104A/104B and 107 and all other parcels required for construction of the Front Street and Valrico Road intersection improvement project can be adequately accommodated within the currently approved FY 17 capital improvement budget for this project. All property owners for the referenced parcels have been notified about the proposed acquisitions.
- A-32 Approve the contract with Dalton Carl Davis and Larry R. Carlisle to acquire a 1.45-acre parcel of land within the Lower Green Swamp Preserve as part of the Jan K. Platt Environmental Lands Acquisition and Protection Program (ELAPP) for \$80,000, and authorize staff to complete the transaction in accordance with the contract. The purchase price is equal to the County staff appraisal of this property. The property is the second of three inholding properties in this portion of the site that collectively will improve security and facilitate the management of this ELAPP site. Anticipated transactional costs will not exceed \$5,000, and capital management costs (including structure demolition) will not exceed \$8,000. Funding for acquisition, transactional costs, and capital management will not exceed \$93,000, which can be adequately accommodated within the project's approved ELAPP CIP funding. The additional operational expenses (less than \$300 annually) can be adequately accommodated by the Conservation and Environmental Lands Management Department's operating budget from the Countywide General Fund.
- A-33 Approve the second amendment to the contract for sale and purchase of real property with the Housing Authority of the City of Tampa (THA) to extend the inspection period from 180 days to a date certain of March 31, 2017. The contract for sale and purchase of real property between the County and THA was approved by the BOCC on April 6, 2016, and amended on July 20, 2016, to extend the inspection period (collectively contract). The contract relates to THA's acquisition of a County-owned six-acre parcel of land located within the West River Master Plan redevelopment area (West River). West River has been identified by the City of Tampa as a focal area proposed for redevelopment as a mixed-income, mixed-use neighborhood along the Hillsborough River. The sale of the County parcel will enable THA, in partnership with the City, to implement the West River plan. THA only recently engaged its development partner and requests the inspection period be extended to a date certain of March 31, 2017, to provide sufficient time to conduct certain due diligence tasks. The inspection period may terminate earlier with THA's written notice to the County. The parties also agree to add a 45-day

written notice provision for any additional requests to extend the inspection period. There is no financial impact associated with this item.

A-34 Approve Change Order 1 (FINAL) with Bandes Construction Company Inc., construction manager for the Progress Village Recreation Center at Larry Sanders Complex (CIP 83222) and Ruskin Area Recreation Center (CIP 83228), Bid RFP-C-0004-0-2014/DV, to reduce the contract by an amount of \$172,629.88 and to deduct 105 days of unused allowance time for the two locations, as explained in the background. The projects are complete, and the final change order is necessary to make final payment and to close out the contract. This action will result in a credit to the County in the amount of \$172,629.88. No additional funds are required.

Procurement Services

The advertised bid document allowed for the award of up to three separate contractors, based on the lowest cost multiplier to be utilized with the RS Means Cost Data publications. These agreements obtain competitive pricing by bundling projects, reduce staff costs by eliminating multiple procurement actions, and reduce the time to execute the work. Work will be assigned up to the maximum amount awarded. Bids were received from four different vendors. Funding will come from various projects with various funding sources. Purchase orders will be issued only against approved budgets.
- B-13 Award and execute the agreements with the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidders, J.V.A. Construction Inc., Kenyon & Partners Inc., Prodigy Contracting Group Inc., J.O. Delotto & Sons Inc., and Lema Construction and Developers Inc., in the amount of \$1,500,000 per each agreement, to perform moderately complex construction and renovation work required at various facilities and sites throughout the County (Bid 6985) for the Real Estate and Facilities Services Department. These agreements will be in effect for two years, beginning on the effective date shown on the contract purchase agreements. The County's Disadvantaged Minority/Disadvantaged Women Business Enterprise (DW/DWBE) Goal-Setting Committee established a DM/DWBE program participation goal of 10 percent, and all of the recommended contractors have committed to achieving this goal. The advertised bid document allowed for the award of up to six separate contractors, based on the lowest cost multiplier, based on RS Means Cost Data. Work will be assigned up to the maximum amount awarded. Bids were received from seven different vendors. Funding will be provided from various funding sources based on the projects. Purchase orders will be issued only against approved budgets.
- B-14 Award and execute the agreement with the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidder, Rush Truck Leasing Inc., in the amount of \$3,245,168.28 for the leasing of 18 semi-tractor trailer trucks that will be used to transfer solid waste between facilities throughout the County (Bid 6319,2) for the Public Works Department. This agreement will be in effect upon the execution by both parties, for a seven-year closed-ended period, from the date each vehicle is accepted through the end of the last remaining vehicle's lease. The vehicles leased under this agreement will replace existing County-owned vehicles. A future recommendation will likely be submitted to the BOCC that requests the replaced County-owned vehicles be declared surplus and authorize the sale of each by public auction. The Economic Development Department did not have three Disadvantaged Minority/Disadvantaged Women Business Enterprise (DM/DWBE) or three Small Business Enterprise (SBE) firms registered for the specified services; therefore, no DM/DWBE participation goal or SBE set aside was established and included in this solicitation. Bids were received from four different vendors. There are sufficient funds in the requesting department's operating enterprise budgets. Purchase orders will be issued only against approved budgets.

The total targeted amount of revenues under the Policy is \$600 Million over the next ten years. Additional funding options include Mobility Fees, Impact Fees, Proportionate Share Payments, and Grants. (*Related to Item G-3*)
