Background:

The Town Council requested that Staff prepare an ordinance providing time limitations for the installation of storm panels and shutters.

Staff initially presented an Ordinance adopting a new Section 34-876 of the Town Code providing that storm panels and shutters shall not be permitted to cover window and/or door openings with the following exceptions:

1. If a hurricane or tropical storm warning or watch has been issued for any portion of Palm Beach County, storm panels and shutters may be installed and must be removed within two (2) weeks of the end of the storm event or the cancellation of the hurricane or tropical storm warning or watch.
2. During hurricane season (June 1st to November 30th), storm panels and shutters may be installed **if the structure remains unoccupied**. The panels and shutters may be installed two (2) weeks prior to the beginning of hurricane season and must be removed within two (2) weeks after the end of the hurricane season. Occupied structures are governed by the regulations in the paragraph above.

The Town Code requires that the Planning and Zoning Board review all amendments to Chapter 34 of the Town Code.

The Planning and Zoning Board determined that the Ordinance should be restricted to apply only to storm panels and not to storm shutters. Staff revised the Ordinance as directed by the Board and included the following definition of the term "storm panel":



For the purposes of this section, storm panels shall mean steel, aluminum or polycarbonate panels or fabric coverings intended to protect structure openings during storm events that are: attached to the structure through the use of tracks, bolts or hooks; not permanently affixed to the structure; and stored out of sight when not in use. The term storm panels shall not include storm shutters that are properly permitted and permanently affixed to the structure, including, but not limited to, roll-down shutters, accordion shutters, colonial shutters and bahama shutters.

The Planning and Zoning Board also requested that language be added to provide that storm panels that cover windows and doors of unoccupied structures that are not visible from a street, alley, traveled road or adjacent property are permitted at all times. This additional amendment is incorporated as subsection (3).

As back up, Staff has attached both the Ordinance approved by the Planning and Zoning Board and the Ordinance originally presented to the Board for a recommendation.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Council adopt Ordinance No. 688 (as originally presented or as revised by the Planning and Zoning Board) on first reading.

5 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JUNO
6 BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING DIVISION 1, "GENERALLY," OF
7 ARTICLE IV, "SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS," OF CHAPTER 34,
8 "ZONING," OF THE TOWN CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADOPTING A
9 NEW SECTION 34-876, "STORM PANELS AND SHUTTERS;"
10 PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS AND
11 AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

13 WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to enact regulations for the use of storm
14 panels and shutters within the Town in the interests of both safety and aesthetics; and
15

16 WHEREAS, the Town Council determines that the adoption of this Ordinance is in
17 the best interests of the residents and citizens of the Town of Juno Beach.
18

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE
20 TOWN OF JUNO BEACH, FLORIDA as follows:
21

22 **Section 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and
23 incorporated herein.
24

25 **Section 2.** The Town Council hereby amends Division 1, "Generally," of Article
26 IV, "Supplemental Regulations," of Chapter 34, "Zoning," by adopting a new Section 34-
27 876 to read as follows (additional language underlined):
28

29 **Sec. 34-876. Storm panels and shutters.**
30

31 Storm panels and storm shutters, either permanent or temporary,
32 shall not be permitted to cover the window and/or door openings of a
33 structure, except as provided below:
34

35 (1) Storm panels and storm shutters shall not be permitted to
36 cover window and/or door openings unless a hurricane or
37 tropical storm warning or watch has been issued for any
38 portion of Palm Beach County. In the event of a hurricane or
39 tropical storm warning or watch, storm panels and storm
40 shutters are permitted to cover window and/or door openings,
41 but must be removed or opened, as applicable, within two (2)
42 weeks of the end of the storm event or the cancellation of the
43 hurricane or tropical storm warning or watch.
44

45 (2) During hurricane season (from June 1st to November 30th of
46 each year), storm panels and storm shutters may cover
47 window or/or door openings if the structure remains
48 unoccupied. In such event, storm shutters and panels may

1 not be installed or closed, as applicable, more than two (2)
2 weeks prior to the beginning of hurricane season and must be
3 removed or opened, as applicable, no more than two (2)
4 weeks after the end of hurricane season. All occupied
5 structures shall comply with the provisions of subsection (1)
6 above.

7
8 **Section 3.** The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part
9 of the Code of the Town of Juno Beach, Florida.

10
11 **Section 4.** If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this
12 Ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be
13 unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of the
14 Ordinance.

15
16 **Section 5.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance
17 are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

18
19 **Section 6.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption
