BRIEF OVERVIEW:

At the Board's direction we have prepared an amendment to the County's Fertilizer Ordinance to allow for the Certification of residential homeowners to apply fertilizer during prohibited time periods.

Set a Public Hearing pertaining to natural resources, fertilizer use and landscape maintenance practices.

Set a Public Hearing on March 28, 2017 at 1:40 p.m. on an Ordinance of Citrus County, Florida, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, pertaining to natural resources, fertilizer use and landscape maintenance practices, amending Section 66-103 entitled "Exemptions"; providing for severability; providing for codification and inclusion into the code; providing for modifications that may arise from consideration at public hearing; providing for repeal of inconsistent provisions; and providing for an effective date.

9	PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; AND				
10	PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.				
11	WHEREAS, the Citrus County Board of County Commissioners ("Board") is the legislative				
12	and governing body of Citrus County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, authorized to				
13	exercise governmental powers pursuant to Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of Florida				
14	and Section 125.01, Florida Statutes; and				
15	WHEREAS, in 2014, the Board adopted Ordinance 2014-A19, adding Division 4 to Chapter				
16	66, Article II of the Citrus County Code pertaining to Natural Resources; and				
17	WHEREAS, in 2016, the Board adopted Ordinance 2016-A29, amending portions of				
18	Chapter 66, Article II of the Citrus County Code pertaining to Natural Resources as part of a				
19	comprehensive program to address non-point sources of nutrient pollution on Urban Landscapes				
20	in order to adequately address urban fertilizer contributions to non-point source nutrient loading				
21	to local water bodies and to regulate the use of fertilizers near waterways and during various				
22	months of the years, having found same to be in the best interests of the citizens of the County;

24	WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds that residential homeowners who have received a				
25	Florida Department of Environmental Protection Green Industry – Best Management Practices				
26	Certificate of Training should be permitted to fertilize their lawns in accordance with their				
27	training during the prohibited application period for dormant months,				
28	WHEREAS, for these reasons, the Board hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the				
29	citizens of the County to permit certain certified residential homeowners to fertilize their lawns				
30	during the prohibited application period, in accordance with their training.				
31	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
