Recommendation

Approve Ordinance 2021-05 on First Reading

Background

Currently, Section 6.3.2 of the Village's Code provides that each residential unit shall have a sufficient number of garbage cans or approved containers, not to exceed forty (40) gallons in capacity.

The industry standard with respect to the maximum capacity for garbage cans has evolved overtime and a maximum capacity of forty (40) gallons is no longer standard.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE COMMISSION OF THE VILLAGE OF BISCAYNE PARK, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 6.3.2 "CONTAINERS" OF SECTION 6.3 "SOLID WASTE" OF CHAPTER 6 "PUBLIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES" OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF BISCAYNE PARK, TO ELIMINATE THE MAXIMUM CAPACITY REQUIREMENTS FOR GARBAGE CANS AND APPROVED CONTAINERS; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE AND SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes provide that municipalities shall have the governmental, corporate, and proprietary powers to enable them to conduct municipal government, perform municipal functions, and render municipal service, and exercise any power for municipal purposes, except when expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 6 of the Land Development Code (the "Code") of the Village of Biscayne Park (the "Village") governs public facilities and services; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.3.2 of the Village's Code provides that each residential unit shall have a sufficient number of garbage cans or approved containers, not to exceed forty (40) gallons in capacity, to accommodate all garbage, leaves and grass cuttings; and

WHEREAS, the industry standard with respect to the maximum capacity for garbage cans has evolved overtime and a maximum capacity of forty (40) gallons is no longer standard; and

WHEREAS, the Village Commission wishes to amend the Code to eliminate the maximum capacity requirements for garbage cans and approved containers within the Village, to provide flexibility and allow for the use of higher capacity cans or containers consistent with industry standards.

WHEREAS, on April _____, 2021, the Village Planning & Zoning Board, as the local planning agency for the Village, held its hearing on this proposed Ordinance with due public notice and input; and

WHEREAS, on May _____, 2021 the Village Commission held a first reading and public hearing of this proposed Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on June _____, 2021 the Village Commission held a second reading and public hearing of this proposed Ordinance with due public notice and input.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE OF BISCAYNE PARK, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct, and incorporated herein by this reference and are hereby adopted as the legislative and administrative findings of the Village Commission.

Section 2. Amendments to the Code of Ordinances. Chapter VI of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Biscatne Park, Florida is hereby amended as follows¹:

CHAPTER VI. - PUBLIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES

Sec. 6.3 – Solid waste.

6.3.2. Containers.

(a) Each residential unit shall have a sufficient number of garbage cans or approved containers, not to exceed forty (40) gallons in capacity, to accommodate all garbage, leaves and grass cuttings. Garbage cans shall be kept tightly-closed at all times and easily accessible to collectors. Collection service may be discontinued where the garbage cans or containers are determined to be unfit for receptacles by the public works department. Failure of the property owner to provide proper garbage cans or containers which results in discontinuance of service shall subject the property owner to the penalty provisions of this code.

- <u>Section 3</u>. <u>Inclusion in the Code & Scrivener's Errors.</u> The Village Commission intends that the provisions of this Ordinance be made a part of the Village of Biscayne Park Code of Ordinances, and that sections herein may be renumbered or re-lettered and the words or phrases herein may be changed to accomplish codification; regardless, typographical errors that do not affect intent may be corrected with notice to and authorization of the Village Manager without further process.
- <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Conflicts.</u> Whenever the requirements or provisions of this Ordinance are in conflict with the requirements or provisions of any other lawfully adopted ordinance or statute, the most restrictive shall apply.
- <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason, declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision will not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared.
- **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Village Commission.

Resolution 2021-22 - A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COMMISSION OF THE VILLAGE OF BISCAYNE PARK, FLORIDA APPROVING THE SELECTION OF AVMED AS THE CONTINUATION OF VILLAGE'S HEALTH PLAN AND OTHER BENEFITS PROVIDERS; PROVIDING FOR AN

EFFECTIVE DATE.

Recommendation

I recommend approval of this resolution. After careful consideration and reviewing plan costs, benefit comparisons, employee payroll deductions, and overall impact when moving carriers, it is recommended that the Village of Biscayne Park move the health insurance carrier to AvMed, effective June 1, 2021.

Background

The Village's current health and welfare plan include the following insurance carriers: Humana Health Plan, Solstice Dental and Vision, and Unum Life Insurance. After receiving the renewal plan from Humana with a .41%, decrease the Village administration asked that EBS Advisors, Inc (the Village benefits consultant), seek a plan that could reduce the overall premium cost while maintaining a comparable benefit level.

To accomplish these goals, EBS Advisors sought out rates from all potential insurance carriers serving South Florida.

Cigna, Aetna and Florida League, declined to quote.

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
