BACKGROUND: The Florida State Statute amended Chapter 205 to include Section 205.055 - Exemptions; veterans, spouses of veterans and certain servicemembers, and low-income persons. To reflect the exemptions in the state statute, the implementation of Chapter 66-59 and Chapter 66-60 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Palm Beach Gardens are amended to read:

SECTION 1. Chapter 66. Taxation. of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, is hereby amended at 66-59. Exemption allowed certain disabled persons, the aged, and widows with minor dependents. by renaming said section and by adopting new subsections (b) through (e) and redesignating subsection (b) as subsection (f); providing that Section 66-59 shall hereafter read as follows:

Sec. 66-59. – Exemption allowed certain disabled persons, the aged, and widows with minor dependents, persons receiving public assistance, and persons who are impoverished.

- (a) (This subsection shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted.)
- (b) All persons who are receiving public assistance as defined in Section 409.2554, *Florida Statutes*, as may be amended or renumbered from time to time.
- (c) All persons whose household income is below 130 percent of the federal poverty level based on the current year's federal poverty guidelines.
- (d) A person must complete and sign, under penalty of perjury, a Request for Fee Exemption furnished by the city and provide written documentation in support of his or her request for an exemption under subsection (b) or (c).
- (e) If a person who is exempt under subsection (b) or (c) owns a majority interest in a business with fewer than 100 employees, the business is exempt. Such person must complete and sign, under penalty of perjury, a Request for Fee Exemption furnished by the city and provide written documentation in support of his or her request for an exemption for the business under either subsection.
- (b) (f) In no event under this or any other law shall any person, veteran, or otherwise, be allowed any exemption whatsoever from the payment of any amount required by law for the issuance of a business tax receipt to sell intoxicating liquors or malt and vinous beverages.

SECTION 2. Chapter 66. Taxation. of the Code Section Ordinances of the City of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida is hereby amended at 66-60. Exemptions for disabled veterans. is hereby repealed and readopted; providing that Section 66-60 shall hereafter read as follows:

Sec. 66-60. – Exemptions for <u>honorably discharged</u> veterans or their spouses, and for spouses of certain active duty servicemembers.

- (a) A veteran of the United States Armed Forces who was honorably discharged upon separation from service, or the spouse or unremarried surviving spouse of such a veteran.
- (b) The spouse of an active-duty military servicemember who has relocated to the city pursuant to a permanent change of station order.
- (c) A person must complete and sign, under penalty of perjury, a Request for Fee Exemption furnished by the city and provide written documentation in support of his or her request for an exemption under subsection (a) or (b).
- (d) If a person who is exempt under subsection (a) or (b) owns a majority interest in a business with fewer than 100 employees, the business is exempt. Such person must complete and sign, under penalty of perjury, a Request for Fee Exemption furnished by the city and provide written documentation in support of his or her request for an exemption for the business under either subsection.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of Ordinance 9, 2021 as presented on first reading.

- (d) A person must complete and sign, under penalty of perjury, a Request for Fee Exemption furnished by the city and provide written documentation in support of his or her request for an exemption under subsection (b) or (c).
- (e) If a person who is exempt under subsection (b) or (c) owns a majority interest in a business with fewer than 100 employees, the business is exempt. SECTION 2. Chapter 66. Taxation. of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, is hereby amended by repealing Section 66-60. Exemptions for disabled veterans. in its entirety and readopting an entirely new Section 66-60, to be entitled "Exemptions for honorably discharged veterans or their spouses, and for spouses of certain active duty servicemembers."; providing that Section 66-60 shall hereafter read as follows: 30

Sec. 66-60. – Exemptions for disabled honorably discharged veterans or their spouses, and for spouses of certain active duty servicemembers.

- (a) The following veterans, spouse of veterans and certain servicemembers are exempt from paying a business tax and any fees imposed pursuant to Chapter 205, Fla. Stat.:
 - (1) A veteran of the United States Armed Forces who was honorably discharged upon separation from service, or the spouse or unmarried surviving spouse of such a veteran; and
 - (2) The spouse of an active-duty military servicemember who has relocated to the city pursuant to a permanent change of station order.
- (b) A person must complete and sign, under penalty of perjury, a Request for Fee Exemption furnished by the city and provide written documentation in support of

1	his or her request for an exemption under subsection (a)(1) or (a)(2).
