AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 66 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TITLED "TAXATION", BY AMENDING SEC. 66-109 TITLED "SCHEDULE OF TAXES" BY ADJUSTING THE SCHEDULE OF BUSINESS TAX RECEIPTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Key West previously completed a Business Tax Equity Study which thereby permits the municipality to increase local business tax rates of up to 5 percent on alternating years, in accordance with Florida Statute 205.0535;

WHEREAS, the City Commission for the City of Key West finds that it is necessary to adjust the amount charged for business tax receipts to reflect the staff time expended in such renewals; and

WHEREAS, this amendment to Chapter 66 of the Code of Ordinances will promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and visitors of the City of Key West.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA: Section 1: That Sec. 66-109 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows*:

Sec. 66-109. Schedule of taxes.

Each individual who acts as an agent and each individual who acts as a business or sales agent for a corporation engaged in any business mentioned in this section, when his principal has not paid a license in accordance with this section, shall be required to take out a license as agent in his own name. This section shall apply to every person who seeks, negotiates or transacts, for himself or for any other person or corporation mentioned in this section, but not to inactive stockholders in corporations or members of agencies who do not attempt to transact any business for such agency. A license tax in the sum set opposite each of the following businesses, occupations or professions is levied and imposed upon the business, occupation or profession opposite which such sum is set.

The City of Key West migrated to a new software system in August 2018, and as a result, the business tax receipts (BTR) classifications (i.e. type and subtype) were changed in support of the new system's requirements. The new types and subtypes are indicated below, with the original classifications indicated in parentheses to indicate there were no additional classifications added; the existing classification were only re-named and reorganized.

<u>Section 2</u>: If any section, provision, clause, phrase, or application of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall be construed as reasonable and necessary to achieve the lawful purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of said City in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of such conflict. Section 4: This Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the Presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
