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# Ordinance No. 23-5459 Back-In Parking

## **ORDINANCE NO. 23-5459**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SARASOTA, FLORIDA AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF SARASOTA; CHAPTER 33, TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES; ARTICLE IV, STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING; TO ALLOW BACK-IN PARKING IN NON ANGLE PARKING SPACES LOCATED IN SURFACE PARKING LOTS AND IN PUBLIC PARKING GARAGES AS PROVIDED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THE PARTS HEREOF IF DECLARED INVALID; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR READING BY TITLE ONLY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Sarasota City Code, Chapter 33, Traffic and Motor Vehicles, contains regulations regarding enforcement of parking restrictions on streets, off street city parking lots and parking garages; and,

WHEREAS, the availability of public parking and the ability of citizens to utilize convenient public parking is an issue of importance to residents of and visitors to the City of Sarasota; and,

WHEREAS, the City Commission has recently discussed the issue of "backin" parking which is currently not allowed in the City except where permitted by specific signage or wherever required by specific signage; and,

WHEREAS, after discussion, the City Commission adopted a motion by a 5-0 vote to direct the preparation of an ordinance that would authorize the City Manager to allow back-in parking in non-angle spaces in surface parking lots and in parking garages when deemed appropriate; and,

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that the amendments to the City Code as set forth herein, will serve to promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Sarasota.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF SARASOTA, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Sarasota City Code, Chapter 33, Traffic and Motor Vehicles; Article IV, Stopping, Standing or Parking; Section 33-133 is hereby amended to provide as follows: (New text is shown by <u>underline</u> and deleted text is shown by <u>strike through.</u>)

Sec. 33-133. Designation and marking of individual parking spaces; manner of parking.

The City Engineer shall designate and mark off such individual parking spaces as the City Engineer deems proper along the public streets and in the municipal parking lots <u>and garages</u> for the parking of vehicles. At such places where individual parking spaces are so marked off, each vehicle shall be placed entirely within an individual parking space.

- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle or allow any vehicle to be parked in a manner that occupies more than one (1) marked parking space, regardless of whether that space is metered. A separate citation may be issued for each marked parking space, other than the one (1) parking space allowed under this section, which is either partially or wholly occupied by any vehicle not parked in accordance with this section.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle or allow any vehicle to be parked in a direction or manner that is in violation of, or contrary to, the requirements of this section or posted signs regulating the direction of parked vehicles in marked spaces, regardless of whether the spaces are metered. Vehicles shall be parked with the front end of the vehicle to the curb, unless parallel

parked or unless a posted sign requires the vehicle to be parked with the rear end of the vehicle to the curb. Notwithstanding the previous sentence, the City Manager shall be authorized to allow optional back-in parking when deemed appropriate after consultation with the Parking Manager, in any non-angle parking space located in a City surface parking lot, in a City parking garage, or in a building where public City owned or controlled parking spaces are provided.

(3) It shall be unlawful for any person to stop, stand, or park a vehicle that is not capable of using an electrical recharging station within any parking space specifically designated for charging an electric vehicle (EV). If a law enforcement officer finds a motor vehicle in violation of this subsection, the officer shall charge the operator of the vehicle with a violation of this Article IV of the Code of the City of Sarasota and a fine shall be assessed in the amount specified in Section 33-167(14) of the Code of the City of Sarasota.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Sarasota City Code, Chapter 33, Traffic and Motor Vehicles; Article IV, Stopping, Standing or Parking; Section 33-151 is hereby amended to provide as follows: (New text is shown by <u>underline</u> and deleted text is shown by <u>strike through.</u>)

# Section 33-151. Parking Permits --- issuance by City Manager.

(a) The City Manager is hereby authorized to issue parking permits on behalf of the City authorizing the holders thereof to use all or specifically designated metered and non metered off street parking lots <u>and parking garages</u> which are owned or controlled by the City.

(b) Such permits may be issued on a monthly, quarterly or semi-annual basis upon payment to the City of such sums and for such designated parking lots as may be approved from time to time by resolution of the City Commission. Each permit shall be evidenced by a written or printed certificate which shall bear the name of the City, the number of the holder's permit and such other pertinent information as may be prescribed by the City Manager.

Section 3. Should any section, sentence, clause, part or provision of this Ordinance be declared invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any part hereof other than the part declared to be invalid. Said provision declared to be invalid shall be deemed severed from the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 4</u>. Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 5</u>. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption at second reading.
