inches at time of planting. When selecting tree species, preference shall be given to those species listed as being medium or highly tolerant to wind as listed in the landscape manual. Table A lists the minimum number of trees required to be provided on-site by net lot size. Street trees may be required and are in addition to Table A's on-site requirements. Unusual trees must comply with the requirements of the underlying zoning district. Notwithstanding anything in Section 30-100.1 to the contrary, a minimum seventy-five percent (75%) of Florida native species plant material is required for all new plantings in public spaces, including parks, and rights-of-way (except where contrary to the efficient use of the public space or a park), which will increase the visibility, enjoyment, and resilience of native Florida plants in the Village, while consuming less energy and environmentally harmful chemicals. A list of current approved native species shall be maintained by the Planning and Zoning Division.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Severability.</u> The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable, and if any sentence, section, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sentences, sections, clauses, or phrases of the Ordinance, but they shall remain in effect it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Codification.</u> It is the intention of the Village Council, and it is hereby ordained the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made part of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Palmetto Bay, Florida, that sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intentions, and that the word "Ordinance" shall be changed to "Section" or other appropriate word.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment at Second Reading.
