## ORDINANCE NO.

1	AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD
2	COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; AMENDING
3	SECTIONS 3-1 THROUGH 3-3 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES
4	("CODE"); REPEALING SECTIONS 3-4, 3-21, AND 3-22 OF THE CODE; AND
5	PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE
6	DATE.
7	(Sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners)
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9	WHEREAS, Florida law preempts the regulation of many aspects of alcoholic
10	beverage establishments to the state;
11	WHEREAS, counties are permitted to adopt regulations regarding hours of
12	operation and sale, zoning, sanitary conditions, types of entertainment, and conduct at
13	alcoholic beverage establishments; and
14	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds it appropriate at this time
15	to amend the Broward County Code of Ordinances regarding alcoholic beverages,
16	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
17	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
18	Section 1. Sections 3-1 through 3-3 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances
19	are hereby amended to read as follows:
20	Sec. 3-1. Opening and closing Definitions; hours of establishments selling
21	alcoholic beverages operation and sales.

22 (a) <u>Definitions</u>. The following words and phrases, when used in this chapter,
23 shall have the following meanings:

Alcoholic beverage means distilled spirits and all beverages containing one-half of
 <u>1 percent (0.5%) or more alcohol by volume, determined by measuring the volume of the</u>
 <u>standard ethyl alcohol in the beverage and comparing it with the volume of the remainder</u>

27 <u>of the ingredients as though said remainder ingredients were distilled water.</u>

*Establishment* means any place of business of a person or entity that has been
 licensed by the State of Florida for the sale of alcoholic beverages under the provisions
 of the Beverage Law (Chapters 561-568, Florida Statutes, as amended).

31 Hours of operation and sale. The opening hours of all eEstablishments <del>(a)</del> (b) 32 selling alcoholic beverages and which lie outside of the boundaries of duly incorporated 33 municipalities located within the unincorporated areas of Broward County and which meet 34 all of the following requirements shall be no earlier than 8:00 a.m. on weekdays and 35 Saturdays, and 12:00 noon on Sundays, and the closing hours for such establishments 36 shall be no later than 4:00 a.m. every day: shall not sell or distribute alcoholic beverages, 37 or permit alcoholic beverages to be consumed at the establishment, earlier than 8:00 a.m. 38 on weekdays and Saturdays, or 12:00 noon on Sundays, and must close no later than 39 2:00 a.m. on weekdays and Saturdays, and no later than 3:00 a.m. on Sundays.

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(1) Intoxicating beverage is served, sold, given away, or consumed on the premises; and

42 (2) Said establishment has a floor area of two thousand (2,000) square feet or
 43 more.

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(b) The opening hours of all establishments selling alcoholic beverages and
which lie outside of the boundaries of duly incorporated municipalities within Broward
County and which do not meet all of the above-listed requirements shall be no earlier than
8:00 a.m. on weekdays and Saturdays, and 12:00 noon on Sundays, and the closing
hours for such establishments shall be no later than 2:00 a.m. on weekdays and
Saturdays, and no later than 3:00 a.m. on Sundays.

50 Violation of this section shall be prosecuted in the same manner as (c) 51 misdemeanors are prosecuted. Such violations shall be prosecuted in the name of the 52 state in a court having jurisdiction of misdemeanors by the prosecuting attorney thereof. 53 and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars 54 (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed sixty (60) days or by both 55 such fine and imprisonment *Enforcement and penalty*. This section may be enforced by 56 code enforcement officers, including municipal code enforcement officers, and any law 57 enforcement agency having jurisdiction over the area where the establishment is located, 58 pursuant to Section 125.69 and Chapter 162, Florida Statutes, or any applicable 59 municipal code enforcement provision. Violations of this section are subject to 60 prosecution and punishment as misdemeanors pursuant to Section 125.69(1), Florida 61 Statutes, as amended.

(d) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions in of Subsections <u>3-1(a)</u> and (b)
herein, the opening hours for all <u>County-</u>authorized concessionaires selling alcoholic
beverages in the passenger terminal facilities at the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood
International Airport shall be no earlier than 8:00 a.m. each day, including Sunday, and
the closing hours for such establishments shall be no later than 4:00 a.m. the following

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67 day or on any County-owned or -operated property within the unincorporated areas of 68 Broward County may only sell alcoholic beverages during the days and hours specified 69 in their concession agreements with the County. 70 Sec. 3-2. Unlawful consumption in public places; definition; penalty. 71 **Definitions** Applicability. (a) 72 (1)Alcoholic beverage: Any beverage which contains more than one-per cent 73 of alcohol by weight. 74 (2)Establishment: Any place of business which has been licensed by the State 75 of Florida for the sale of alcoholic beverages under the provisions of the 76 Beverage Law (Chapters 561-568, F.S.). 77 The provisions of this section shall apply countywide, unless in conflict with an 78 applicable municipal ordinance, pursuant to Section 11.01 of the Broward County Charter. 79 Unless otherwise provided, nothing in this section shall be construed to alleviate the 80 obligation to comply with applicable County or municipal regulations. 81 (b) Prohibitions. 82 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to consume any alcoholic beverage upon 83 any area available for use by the public for motor vehicle parking purposes, 84 or any public street, highway, or sidewalk, where such area adjoins or is 85 adjacent or appurtenant to any establishment within Broward County, 86 Florida, where alcoholic beverages are sold or dispensed. 87 88 (3) It shall be unlawful for any person, or for the officers, employees, servants 89 or agents of any person, firm, association, or corporation licensed by the

90 State of Florida for the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption either
91 on or off the premises, to:

- 92 a. Sell, serve, or dispense any alcoholic beverage to any person upon
   93 any motor vehicle parking area which that adjoins or is adjacent to or
   94 adjoining, or appurtenant to any establishment within Broward
   95 County, Florida, licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages; or,
- b. Knowingly permit the consumption of any alcoholic beverage by any
  person upon any motor vehicle parking area which that adjoins or
  is adjacent to or adjoining, or appurtenant to any establishment
  within Broward County, Florida, licensed for the sale of alcoholic
  beverages.
- 101 Enforcement and Ppenalty. Any person convicted of violating any provision (c) 102 in this section shall be punished as provided by law This section may be enforced by 103 code enforcement officers, including municipal code enforcement officers, and any law 104 enforcement agency having jurisdiction over the area where the establishment is located, 105 pursuant to Section 125.69 and Chapter 162, Florida Statutes, or any applicable 106 municipal code enforcement provision. Violations of this section are subject to 107 prosecution and punishment as misdemeanors pursuant to Section 125.69(1), Florida 108 Statutes, as amended.
- Sec. 3-3. Possession of <u>an</u> open container <u>of an alcoholic beverage</u>,
   consumption in motor vehicle.
- (1) (a) Policy and lintent: The Broward County Board of County Commissioners
   of Broward County finds that the consumption possession of an open container containing

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an alcoholic beverages while driving operating or riding in or on a motor vehicle poses a
 grave and imminent hazard to the health and welfare of the residents of Broward County.
 Therefore, it is declared to be the policy of Broward County that the consumption of
 alcoholic beverages and the possession of any open container containing an alcoholic
 beverages while driving operating or riding in or on a motor vehicle is prohibited.

- 118 (2) *Definitions:* The following words and phrases when used in this section
   119 shall, for the purposes of this section, have the following meanings:
- 120 (a) *Motor vehicle:* Any vehicle propelled by other than muscular power.
- 121 (b) Alcoholic beverage: Any beverage which contains more than one (1)
   122 percent of alcohol by weight.
- 123 (c) *Highway:* Any public street, avenue, boulevard, roadway, alley, sidewalk
   124 and other right-of-way located within Broward County.
- (d) Open container: Any bottle, can or other receptacle containing any alcoholic
   beverage or any mixture containing an alcoholic beverage which has been
   opened, or a seal broken, or the contents of which have been partially
   removed. An open container shall not be considered in the possession of a
   person if the open container is located in a locked glove compartment, trunk
   or other locked compartment in the motor vehicle.

(3) (b) Prohibitions: No person shall drink from nor have in his possession any
 open container containing any alcoholic beverage or any mixture containing an alcoholic
 beverage while in or on a motor vehicle, whether moving or stopped, upon any highway.
 Any conduct in violation of Section 316.1936, Florida Statutes, as amended, prohibiting
 possession of an alcoholic beverage in a vehicle, shall be a violation of this section.

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(4) *Exception; Vehicles for Hire:* No person shall be in violation of this section
who is a passenger in a motor vehicle operated by a motor carrier certificated or
registered in accordance with the provisions of chapter 22½ of the Broward County Code
of Ordinances, or a passenger in a motor vehicle with a passenger capacity of more than
eight (8), which motor vehicle is regularly engaged in the business of providing passenger
transportation for compensation and is being operated by a person for compensation.

142 (5) (c) Enforcement: <u>and penalty</u>. It shall be the duty and responsibility of all law
143 enforcement officers <u>having jurisdiction over the area where the violation occurs</u> to
144 enforce the provisions of this section. <u>Violations of this section are subject to prosecution</u>
145 <u>and punishment as misdemeanors pursuant to Section 125.69(1)</u>, Florida Statutes, as
146 <u>amended</u>.

147 (6) *Penalty:* Any person convicted of violating any portion of this section shall
148 be punished as provided by law.

Section 2. Sections 3-4, 3-21, and 3-22 of the Broward County Code ofOrdinances are hereby repealed in their entirety.

151 Section 3. Severability.

152 If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid 153 portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this 154 Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be 155 legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such 156 determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, 157 group, entity, property, or circumstance.

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158 Section 4. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

159 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this 160 Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective 161 date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word 162 "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or 163 phrase to the extent necessary to accomplish such intention.

164 Section 5. Effective Date.

165 This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law.
