MAYOR AND **ORDINANCE** OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH MIAMI, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 15, "OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS," ARTICLE I. GENERAL," SECTION 15-63 "MOBILE VENDORS" TO **PERMIT** SPECIAL EVENTS **FEATURING MOBILE** AND VENDORS FOR RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS **ESTABLISH** REGULATIONS **AND PERMIT PROCEDURES: PROVIDING** FOR **CORRECTIONS:** PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR **CONFLICTS: PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND** AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 15-63 of the City of South Miami (the "City") Code of Ordinances (the "Code") prohibits mobile vendors from operating in the City except in (a) I-zoned districts; (b) upon construction sites where work is actively in progress; (c) in connection with special events, exhibitions, expositions, art shows, and festivals, upon compliance with terms and conditions; and (d) in connection with drinking establishments subject to limitations; and

WHEREAS, Section 15-63 further provides that mobile vendors cannot remain at a site for more than thirty minutes unless allowed by special event permit or by City Commission resolution: and

WHEREAS, as described above, the City allows mobile food vending operations in certain instances, consistent with Section 509.102, Florida Statutes, which provides that the City "may not prohibit mobile food dispensing vehicles or temporary commercial kitchens from operating within the entirety of the [City's] jurisdiction;" and

WHEREAS, the City Commission discussed amending mobile vendor regulations to allow for special events at properties owned and operated by religious institutions that would permit mobile vendors pursuant to a special event permit for reasonable times and subject to reasonable regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that special mobile food vendor events can foster community engagement and neighborhood relations, and provide an opportunity for the public to gather in an enjoyable atmosphere where they can be exposed to the offerings of local food vendors and the work of community serving entities such as religious institutions; and

WHEREAS, to promote compatibility with neighboring uses and provide for public safety, the City Commission finds it appropriate to require special event permits for special mobile food vendor operations at religious institutions, and to include requirements and/or limitations as to noise, security, parking, and other elements of the operation to address potential impacts to neighboring properties; and

47 48 WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that there are outdated references in Section 15-49 63, such as to I-zoned zoning districts, which the City no longer has, that should be edited as part 50 of this Ordinance; and 51 52 WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to amend Chapter 15, "Offenses and 53 Miscellaneous Provisions," Article I. "In General," Section 15-63 "Mobile Vendors" of the City 54 Code to permit special events featuring mobile vendors for properties owned and operated by 55 religious institutions and establish regulations and permit procedures 56 57 WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that this Ordinance is in the best interest and welfare of the City, and approved it on first reading on Marvh 18, 2025; and 58 59 WHEREAS, on ______, the Mayor and City Commission conducted a duly 60 noticed public hearing as required by law and approved the ordinance. 61 62 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY 63 COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH MIAMI, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:1 64 65 66 Section 1. **Recitals.** The above-stated recitals are true and correct and are incorporated 67 herein by this reference. 68 69 Amending Chapter 15, Article I, Section 15-63 of the City Code. Section 2. Chapter 15, "Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions," Article I. "In General," Section 15-63 70 "Mobile Vendors" of the City Code is hereby amended as follows: 71 72 73 74 Sec. 15-63. Mobile vendors. 75 (a) It shall be unlawful to sell, offer to sell, or exhibit for sale any goods or merchandise, 76 including, but not limited to, fruits, nuts, popcorn, ice cream or sandwiches from any 77 parked vehicle or stand set upon any street or sidewalk in the city, or from the exteriors 78 of buildings licensed for sales, unless otherwise provided herein, in the land 79 development code, or in section 4-2 of this Code. 80 (b) A mobile vendor is any person, firm, corporation or other entity which travels from place to place selling any and all goods, wares, and merchandise, including, 81 specifically, food, food products and beverages. 82 (c) All mobile vendors are prohibited from operating or doing business in the city, except 83 84 as hereinafter provided. 85 (d) Mobile vendors selling food, food products and beverages may operate and do business

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in "I" zoned districts, upon construction sites where work is actively in progress, and

87 in any zoning district where a permitted special event, exhibition, exposition, art show 88 and/or festival is taking place upon the following terms and conditions: 89 (1) No mobile vendor shall station itself upon any public street or right-of-way. 90 Neither shall any mobile vendor station itself upon any private property except 91 with the express permission of the owner thereof and in a manner which does 92 not impede the flow of traffic in public streets or rights-of-way, nor block pedestrian access to public streets or rights-of-way. 93 94 (2) All mobile vendors must provided for their own trash and garbage removal such 95 that no trash or garbage remains on the premises upon which the vending was 96 conducted. 97 (3) No mobile vendor shall remain in any one site longer than thirty (30) minutes, 98 except in the case of a special event, exhibition, exposition, art show and/or 99 festival in which case it shall not exceed the time allowed by the special event 100 permit, or when further specifically permitted by a majority affirmative vote of 101 the city commission by resolution. 102 (4) Mobile vendors must operate from four-wheel motorized vehicles registered in 103 the state, except in the cases of fairs, exhibitions and expositions not exceeding 104 five (5) days. 105 Special Mobile Vendor Events for Religious Institutions. Notwithstanding the (e) restrictions in sub-section (d) above, special mobile vendor food events on private 106 property owned and operated by religious institutions may be allowed by special event 107 permit issued by the City Manager subject to conditions addressing all of the 108 109 following: 110 (1) No more than five (5) food trucks allowed for any single event; 111 (2) The applicant shall provide sufficient temporary or permanent bathroom 112 facilities for patrons of the event, as determined by the City Manager based on 113 expected attendance; 114 (3) The event may be open to the public from 5 PM to 11 PM on Thursday, Friday, 115 or Saturday night; 116 (4) Generators and mechanical equipment shall employ noise reduction measures, 117 as appropriate for the proximity of the location to residential uses; 118 (5) Lighting shall be provided to maintain a minimum of one (1) foot-candle on 119 the surface, consistent with surface parking lot lighting requirements 120 promulgated by Miami-Dade County; (6) Professional security or off-duty police officers shall be provided at the 121 122 expense of the permittee, in quantity and at times determined by the City 123 Manager after consultation with the Police Department, to be appropriate for 124 public safety for the particular event; 125 (7) The permittee shall provide for solid waste and recycling collection and 126 removal on-site;

127	(8) Ground covering and temporary furniture and structures as appropriate to the		
128	nature and size of the event;		
129	(9) Parking shall be provided on-site or on public parking spaces, and shall not		
130	occur on swales, medians, or other private property;		
131	(10) The sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages may be prohibited or limited;		
132	(10) To the extent feasible, the permittee shall be encouraged to use local vendors		
133	or mobile vendors associated with local vendors; and		
134	(11) The City Manager may affix additional conditions as necessary, including a		
135	limitation on the maximum capacity of attendees, for the (i) particular event,		
136	(ii) for the particular location, or (iii) for the particular operator based upon its		
137	history of events.		
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139	The City Manager may approve a recurring series of events for a period of time,		
140	subject to modification of the permit or revocation of such permit based on the		
141	conduct of events. Any special event permit authorized under this subsection shall		
142	be subject to revocation for failure to meet permit conditions or the requirements		
143	and limitations of the City Code.		
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146	Section 3. Corrections. Conforming language or technical scrivener-type corrections		
147	may be made by the City Attorney for any conforming amendments to be incorporated into the		
148	final Ordinance for signature.		
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150	Section 4. Severability. If any section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this Ordinance		
151	is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the holding		
152 153	shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.		
154	Section 5. Conflicts. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, resolutions or parts		
155	of resolutions, in conflict herewith, are repealed to the extent of such conflict.		
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157	Section 6. Implementation. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take any and		
158	all necessary action to implement the purposes of this Ordinance.		
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160	Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon		
161 162	adoption.
