Statement of Issue

On September 5, 2006, the County adopted its Impact Fee Ordinance (05-06-44). The ordinance has been amended several times since the September 2006 adoption date. The Board has suspended impact fees regularly beginning in 2009. The Impact Fees moratorium is in place through August 2025. Staff is seeking the Board's direction regarding an extension of the impact fee moratorium.

The Board approved the agreement between Highlands County and Alfred Benesch & Company for the completion of the Highland's County Comprehensive Alternative Revenue (CAR) Study.

Highlands County's comprehensive funding study includes an evaluation of impact fees, Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU), Municipal Service Benefit Unit (MSBU) and other alternative revenues.

In addition to the development of impact fees, the study is to evaluate whether implementation of other funding programs would be beneficial. Additionally, a rate analysis will also be completed for stormwater facilities.
