ORDINANCE NO. 2025-08

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HARDEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, RELATING TO MINING; AMENDING THE HARDEE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FUTURE LAND USE MAP SERIES TO AMEND THE MINING OVERYLAY MAP AND FUTURE LAND USE ELEMENT POLICY L1.17 SPECIFIC TO THE MINING OVERLAY DISTRICT AND AMENDING THE DEFINITIONS SECTION TO PROVIDE CLARITY FOR REQUIREMENTS PERTAINING TO THE MINING OVERLAY DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS,

SEVERABILITY, AND FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Sections 163.3161 through 163.3215, Florida Statutes, the Community Planning Act, empowers and mandates Hardee County, Florida to plan for future development and growth and to adopt and amend comprehensive plans, or elements or portions thereof, to guide the future growth and development of the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, the County Commission held public hearings on Ordinance No. 2025-08 with due public notice having been provided, to obtain public comment, and considered all written and oral comments received during public hearings, including supporting documents; and

WHEREAS, in exercise of its authority the Hardee County Board of County Commissioners has determined it necessary to adopt amendments to the County's Comprehensive Plan, which are attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by this reference made part hereof, to ensure that the Comprehensive Plan is in full compliance with the laws of the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedures required by Sections 166.041(3)(c)(2), Florida Statutes, and other applicable law, the regulations contained within the ordinance were hearings, including supporting documents; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedures required by Sections 166.041(3)(c)2, Florida Statutes, and other applicable law, the regulations contained within this ordinance were considered by the County's Planning and Zoning Board, sitting as the Local Planning Agency (LPA) as designated by the County at a duly advertised public meeting on October 2, 2025, at which

time interested parties and citizens had the opportunity to be heard and such amendments were
recommended to the Board of County Commissioners adoption; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with section 252.422(2)(b), Florida Statutes, this Ordinance does not impose any additional requirements or burdens, nor does it create any substantive rights nor hinder any existing permissible development activities; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Expedited State Review procedures required by Section 163.3184(3), the County transmitted the proposed amendment and supporting data and analysis to the applicable review agencies.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF HARDEE COUNTY, FLORIDA:1

<u>Section 1.</u> The provisions set forth in the recitals to this Ordinance (whereas clauses) are hereby adopted by the Board of County Commissioners as legislative findings and intent pertaining to this Ordinance.

Section 2. Hardee County hereby adopts the FLU Map 2 - Phosphate Mining Overlay and Non-Phosphate Mining Area Map in the Future Land Use Map Series and language in the Future Land Use Element and the Definitions Section.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be codified in the Hardee County Comprehensive Plan. A certified copy of this enacting ordinance shall be located in the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Hardee County. The Clerk shall also make copies available to the public for a reasonable publication charge.

<u>Section 4.</u> If any provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of any other provision, and to that end the provisions of this Ordinance hereby declared severable.

<u>Section 5.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

55	<u>Section 6.</u> That it is the intention of the Board, and it is hereby ordained that the
56	provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Comprehensive Plan, that
57	the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intentions,
58	and that the word Ordinance shall be changed to Section or other appropriate word.
59	<u>Section 7.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> The effective date of these amendments, if the
60	amendments are not timely challenged, shall be 31 days after the State Land Planning Agency
61	notifies the local government that the plan amendment package is complete. If timely
62	challenged, the amendments shall become effective on the date the State Land Planning Agency
63	or the Administration Commission enters a final order determining the adopted amendments to
64	be in compliance. No development orders, development permits, or land uses dependent on
65	these amendments may be issued or commence before it has become effective. If a final order
66	of noncompliance is issued by the Administration Council, the amendments may nevertheless be
67	made effective by adoption of a resolution affirming the effective status, a copy of which
68	resolution shall be sent to the State Land Planning Agency.

Amending the Hardee County Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use series to amend the Mining Overlay Map to update the map, and include No Mine Areas. Also, amending the Comprehensive Plan, Policy L1.17 and the Definitions Section, to clarify the Mining Overlay and to provide definitions for Phosphate Mining.

The Board has determined that the adoption of the amendments are in the best interest of the County by providing clarity to the definition of the Mining Overlay, and to establish clear "Mining" and "No Mining" areas.

RE: Amending the Mining Overlay Map and related text to address Phosphate

Mining (Ordinance 2025-08)

ORDNANCE 2025-08: BACKGROUND AND REASON FOR REQUEST:

The Hardee County Comprehensive Plan ("Plan") addresses a mining overlay in the Future Land Use Element. Amendments to this overlay are proposed to provide greater clarification specific to phosphate mining and no-phosphate mining areas. Areas indicated within the overlay are not a guarantee of phosphate mining entitlements. The proposed amendments provide clarification.

The FLU Map 2 – Mining Overlay Map is proposed to be replaced by the map titled, "FLU Map -2 Phosphate Mining Overlay and No Phosphate Mining Area" for inclusion in the Future Land Use Map series.

It is important to note the following:

- 1) The Phosphate Mining Overlay District identifies areas of Hardee County where phosphate mining has occurred, is occurring, or may occur, but does not provide automatic entitlement for any type of mining.
- 2) The request is a County-initiated amendment to clarify the Mining Overlay district over land where phosphate mining has occurred, is occurring, or may occur. It does not necessarily correspond to a future mine boundary.
- 3) The request does not seek approval for mining activities, nor will approval of the proposed mining overlay grant such permission.
- 4) A mining company must own the property, or have authorization from the property owners, before submitting applications to authorize mining activities.

PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD ACTIONS:

On November 6, 2025, the Hardee County Planning and Zoning Board held a public hearing on the proposed amendments. The Board unanimously voted to approve the amendments with changes. At the property owners' request, the Planning and Zoning Board voted to recommend **removing** the following parcels from the proposed amendment.

PROPOSED COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TEXT AMENDMENTS:

Future Land Use Element

Future Land Use Element Policy L1.17: The Phosphate Mining Overlay District is to identify identifies areas of Hardee County where phosphate mining has occurred, is occurring, or may occur, but does not provide an automatic entitlement for any type of mining. This overlay does not change the underlying Future Land Use designation.

This overlay shall serve as an atlas of pre and post mining geographical conditions including but not limited to soil types, hydrological features, topographical features and land use suitability indices.

It shall also identify land use features during the mining process in 5-year intervals until reclamation is complete.

Lands within this overlay district **not subject to mining may still be included** due to off-site mitigation potential, settling pond locations and other mine related impacts.

A **restrictive mining corridor** in which accelerated reclamation of re-contoured overburden only shall be established to maintain the integrity of the "Development Corridor" generally along U.S. 17 and the Peace River in Central Hardee County.

This "Development Corridor" will be more specifically defined through amendments to the Hardee County Mining Ordinance.


The County may amend the **Phosphate Mining Overlay District** to incorporate additional properties when data and analysis indicates that identification within the Phosphate Mining Overlay District may be appropriate. Such amendment may be based on the contents of an application for text amendment unless coupled with a Future Land Use Map change or when the Phosphate Mining Overlay District is proposed to incorporate land designated Industrial in which case the amendment shall be based on the contents of an application for map amendment.

Amendments to the Definitions

Phosphate Mining: The extraction of phosphate ore from the earth by whatever process including the removal of overburden for the purpose of reaching underlying ore, the reclamation of previously mined land, the transporting, washing, sizing, flotation, storage, drying, grinding and shipping of the phosphate, and all activities reasonably related thereto, except chemical processing.

NonPhosphate Mining Areas: Areas that are not available for phosphate mining as identified on Map XX within the Hardee County Future Land Use Map Series without further amendment to the underlying Future Land Use designation and/or boundaries of the Phosphate Mining Overlay District.




