DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKING AND STORAGE IS PROHIBITED BUT REQUIRES A REGISTRATION PROCESS AND FEE OF \$100.00 WITH AN ACCOMPANYING AFFIDAVIT THAT THE VEHICLE WILL NOT BE USED FOR OCCUPANCY; REQUIRING ALL RECREATIONAL VEHICLES TO DISPLAY CURRENT CITY REGISTRATION TO BE VISIBLE FROM THE STREET; ALLOWING A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE NOT EXCEEDING 35 FEET IN LENGTH TO BE PARKED IN A SIDE YARD NOT CLOSER THAN 3 FEET FROM THE RESIDENCE WITH ALL EXPANDED PANELS RETRACTED; REQUIRING RECREATIONAL VEHICLES TO BE UNOBSTRUCTED, MOUNTED ON WHEELS AND EASILY MOVABLE; PROHIBITING RECREATIONAL VEHICLES PARKED ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY FROM BEING USED FOR LIVING, SLEEPING, COOKING OR STORAGE; ALLOWING NO MORE THAN ONE RECREATIONAL VEHICLE ON SINGLE FAMILY OR DUPLEX PROPERTY; REQUIRING THE RECREATIONAL VEHICLE OWNER TO HOLD A VALID LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE PROPERTY OWNER; PROHIBITING UTILITY CONNECTIONS EXCEPT THROUGH AN EXTENSION CORD FOR BRIEF MAINTENANCE RELATED ACTIVITIES NOT TO EXCEED 24 HOURS; PROHIBITING PARKING ON TOWNHOUSE AND MULTIFAMILY PROPERTIES; AMENDING CHAPTER VII, ARTICLE 1, SECTION 7-6 OF THE CITY OF OPA-LOCKA'S CODE OF ORDINANCES TO DECREASE THE CIVIL PENALTY FOR NONCOMPLIANCE FINE AMOUNT FROM \$500.00 TO \$250.00 FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE (first reading / public hearing held on February 25, 2026). *Sponsored by Commissioner Santiago* **Deferred from 03/11/2026 RCM**
