**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
OF SARASOTA COUNTY, FLORIDA**

**Re: Local Government Infrastructure Sales Tax (Surtax 3) Revised Implementation Dates and Re-allocation of Proceeds Among Projects for County Surtax 3 Project List**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 212.055(2), Florida Statutes, the Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) is authorized to levy by ordinance a local government infrastructure sales tax of one (1%) percent, throughout Sarasota County, Florida (“Sales Tax”) subject to referendum approval; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 6, 2007, Ordinance No. 2007-087 was approved by referendum, continuing the levy of the Local Government Infrastructure Surtax through December 31, 2024 (“Surtax 3”); and

**WHEREAS**, Exhibit A to Ordinance No. 2007-087 contains a list of proposed County Surtax 3 projects with the allocation of Surtax 3 revenues and anticipated implementation dates for each project; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 5.H of Ordinance No. 2007-087, the Board has authority, after a public hearing, to adopt by resolution changes to the Surtax 3 projects; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 13, 2008, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2008-093, replacing Exhibit A with Revised Exhibit A, amending the Surtax 3 project implementation dates related to the approval of Commercial Paper Borrows A-74 through A-77; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 23, 2008, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2008-162, replacing Revised Exhibit A with Second Revised Exhibit A, amending the Surtax 3 project implementation dates related to the approval of Commercial Paper Borrows A-78 through A-82; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 26, 2008, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2008-185, replacing Second Revised Exhibit A with Third Revised Exhibit A, amending the Surtax 3 project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects related to approval of the Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds, Series 2008A; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 24, 2008, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2008-205, replacing Third Revised Exhibit A with Fourth Revised Exhibit A, amending the Surtax 3 project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects related to approval of the Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds, Series 2008B; and

**WHEREAS**, due to the instability of market conditions, the Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds, Series 2008B, approved on September 24, 2008, were never issued; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 12, 2008, the Board approved a revision to the bonding of proposed projects under the Economic Stimulus program; authorizing staff to proceed with the bonding of Surtax 3, with revised project priorities; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 18, 2008, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2008-238, replacing Third Revised Exhibit A with Fourth Revised Exhibit A, amending the Surtax 3 project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects related to approval of the Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds, Series 2008B; and

**WHEREAS**, in order to provide for five-year financial stability, on September 28, 2009, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2009-166, replacing Fourth Revised Exhibit A with Fifth Revised Exhibit A which re-prioritized the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 26, 2010, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2010-013, replacing Fifth Revised Exhibit A with Sixth Revised Exhibit A, revising the allocation of proceeds among projects in the Transportation Category as a result of a modification to a contract for the roadway segment of the Honore Avenue-Pinebrook Extension extending from State Road 681 to the south property line of the South 680 property; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 2, 2010, due to the continuing downturn in the economy and the projected further decline in anticipated revenues, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2010-187, replacing Sixth Revised Exhibit A with Seventh Revised Exhibit A, which re-prioritized the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects to reflect the amount of surtax funding currently programmed for projects; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 22, 2011, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2011-038, replacing Seventh Revised Exhibit A with Eighth Revised Exhibit A, re-allocating proceeds among projects as a result of unanticipated property acquisition and construction costs above engineering estimates needed to fund the construction of sediment management projects throughout Roberts Bay North and Lemon Bay Watersheds as well as the water quality improvement project in Alligator Creek; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 25, 2011, due to the continuing economic downturn in the economy and the projected further decline in anticipated revenues, in order to provide for a financially sustainable fifteen-year program, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2011-099, replacing Eighth Revised Exhibit A with Ninth Revised Exhibit A to re-prioritize the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 7, 2012, in an effort to minimize future borrows and enable projects to commence while limiting additional debt service expenses, and to maintain a financially sustainable fifteen-year program, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2012-073, replacing Ninth Revised Exhibit A with Tenth Revised Exhibit A to re-prioritize the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 5, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-025, replacing Tenth Revised Exhibit A with Eleventh Revised Exhibit A, revising the allocation of proceeds among projects in the Economic Development Surtax Trust Fund Category as a result of the community-initiated improvements to the 348 West Green Street Property, known as the West Dearborn Street Plaza; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 19, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-030, replacing Eleventh Revised Exhibit A with Twelfth Revised Exhibit A, revising the allocation of proceeds among projects in the Environment, Water and Sewer, and Transportation Categories, as a result of bids coming in higher than anticipated to fund the construction contract for the Red Bug Slough Restoration Project, and memorializing the Board approved appropriation of funding for South River Roadway Resurfacing; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 23, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-061, replacing Twelfth Revised Exhibit A with Thirteenth Revised Exhibit A, revising the allocation of proceeds among projects in the Water and Sewer Category, to address the lack of central sewer service for the commercial center known as the “Nokomis Sewer Line”; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 20, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-117, replacing Thirteenth Revised Exhibit A with Fourteenth Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen-year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on October 9, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-162, replacing Fourteenth Revised Exhibit A with Fifteenth Revised Exhibit A, amending the funding programmed within Siesta Key Beach Enhancements due to the utilization of Tourist Development Tax proceeds to fund a portion of eligible project expenditures for the Siesta Public Beach Improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 20, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-198, replacing Fifteenth Revised Exhibit A with Sixteenth Revised Exhibit A, reallocating the funding programmed for the Transportation Category from the Transit Greenaway (Bus Rapid Transit) to Transit Vehicle Purchases; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 7, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2014-066, replacing Sixteenth Revised Exhibit A with Seventeenth Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 20, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2014-105, replacing Seventeenth Revised Exhibit A with Eighteenth Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects to allocate additional surtax funding in FY15 to Roadway Resurfacing, R.L. Anderson Remodel, and Terrace Building Remodel; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 22, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2014-136, replacing Eighteenth Revised Exhibit A with Nineteenth Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects to allocate additional funding in FY15 to South County Courts; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 4, 2015, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2015-047, replacing Nineteenth Revised Exhibit A with Twentieth Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates within the Water and Sewer Category, to match the funding for grant contracts related to Indian Beach Sapphire Shores Bioretention, Hudson Bayou In-stream Restoration, and North Water Tower Park LID (5-0 vote); and

**WHEREAS**, on May 15, 2015, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2015-092, replacing Twentieth Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-first Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 21, 2015, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2015-129, replacing Twenty-first Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-second Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates for South County Courts and R.L. Anderson Remodel, to coincide with proposed public safety referendum; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 18, 2016, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2016-082, replacing Twenty-second Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-third Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 26, 2017, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2017-077, replacing Twenty-third Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-fourth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 20, 2018, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2018-123, replacing Twenty-fourth Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-fifth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 19, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2019-118, replacing Twenty-fifth Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-sixth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 2, 2020, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2020-149, replacing Twenty-sixth Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-seventh Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 23, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2021-098, replacing Twenty-seventh Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-eighth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 27, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2021-131, replacing Twenty-eighth Revised Exhibit A with Twenty-ninth Revised Exhibit A, re-prioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects to allocate additional surtax funding to the Sarasota County Historical Museum; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 7, 2022, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2022-124, replacing Twenty-ninth Revised Exhibit A with Thirtieth Revised Exhibit A, amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects to allocate additional surtax funding to the Dona Bay Storage Facility: and

**WHEREAS**, on June 24, 2022, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2022-131, replacing Thirtieth Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-first Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 8, 2022, Ordinance No. 2022-001 was approved by referendum, continuing the levy of the Local Government Infrastructure Surtax through December 31, 2039 ("Surtax 4"); and

**WHEREAS**, on November 16, 2022, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2022-237, replacing Thirtieth-first Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-second Revised Exhibit A, amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects to allocate additional surtax funding for the Selected County Parks, Parks Infrastructure Renovation, Upgrade, and Replacement Program and reallocation of project management.

**WHEREAS**, on June 21, 2023, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2023-126, replacing Thirty-second Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-third Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 26, 2023, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2023-162, replacing Thirty-third Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-fourth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects; programming additional surtax funding for the Selected County Parks, 17<sup>th</sup> Street Regional Park and Facilities Renovations, Replacements, and Upgrades Program; reallocating project management; and incorporating certain Surtax 4 projects to pay the debt service on the County's Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 through December 31, 2024 from surtax proceeds; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 20, 2024, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2024-103, replacing the Thirty-fourth Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-fifth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 2, 2025, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2025-121, replacing the Thirty-fifth Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-sixth Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects, in an effort to maintain a balanced five-year plan and financially sustainable fifteen year program; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 27, 2026, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2026-019, replacing Thirty-sixth Revised Exhibit A with Thirty-seventh Revised Exhibit A, reprioritizing the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects; programming additional surtax funding for the North County/ Phillippi Creek Stormwater Reuse or other Water Quality Improvement Projects, Forest Lakes Floodplain Creation/Mitigation – Land Acquisition; and

**WHEREAS**, the programming of additional surtax funding for the Facilities Renovations, Replacements, and Upgrades Program necessitates a reprioritization of the Surtax 3 projects by amending the project implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among projects; and

**WHEREAS**, following a duly advertised public hearing, the Board considered the revised implementation dates and the allocation of proceeds among the Surtax 3 projects.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Board of County Commissioners of Sarasota County, Florida, in a public meeting assembled, that:

1. The Thirty-seventh Revised Exhibit A to Ordinance No. 2007-087 is hereby replaced by Thirty-eighth Revised Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.
2. The Board of County Commissioners hereby continues to authorize the use of the infrastructure surtax revenue collected through December 31, 2024 in an amount required to fund the debt service payments required on the County's issuance of Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds, Series 2023, the proceeds of which

will be used to fund select projects included on the Infrastructure Surtax FY25-FY39 (Surtax 4) Project List and which are also hereby added to the Infrastructure Surtax FY10-FY24 (Surtax 3) Project List identified herein. The allocation to these projects is in the required amount and for the limited purpose expressed herein to pay the debt service and is further subject to the Board's approval of the issuance of the Infrastructure Sales Surtax Revenue Bonds and the budgeting of the revenues to pay the debt service on those bonds.

3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the Board.
